PUPPY VACCINATION SCHEDULE

6 WEEKS

Distemper, Adenovirus Type 1 & 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Corona

10 WEEKS

Distemper, Adenovirus Type 1 & 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Corona

14 WEEKS

Distemper, Adenovirus Type 1 & 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Corona, Bordetella

18 WEEKS

Distemper, Adenovirus Type 1 & 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Initial Rabies (1 year)

MONTHLY

Heartworm preventive at 14 weeks, flea and tick preventive (time of year)

ANNUALLY

Distemper, Adenovirus Type 1 & 2, Parvovirus, Parainfluenza, Bordetella, Booster Rabies (3 year), Fecal Flotation, and heartworm test

Canine Distemper

A widespread, often fatal disease.

Adenovirus Type 1 & 2

Causes infectious hepatitis and respiratory infection. Hepatitis caused by Type 1 can cause severe kidney damage and death

Parvovirus

A highly contagious disease that causes severe dehydrating diarrhea in dogs of varying ages. It is especially dangerous and life threatening to puppies.

Parainfluenza

Mild respiratory infection in healthy dogs. It can be dangerous to older dogs or puppies.

Bordetella

Bacterial infection which can occur with other viruses. Causes severe coughing, gagging and other respiratory problems

Corona

A highly contagious intestinal disease causing vomiting and diarrhea in dogs of all ages. Corona can be life threatening in puppies.

Rabies

One of the most publicized and feared diseases and is always fatal. The virus attacks the brain and the central nervous system.

This disease can be transmitted to humans.

KITTEN VACCINATION SCHEDULE

6 WEEKS

Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Chlamydia, de-worming and ear mite exam

10 WEEKS

Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Chlamydia, Feline Leukemia #1, 2nd de-worming

14 WEEKS

Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Chlamydia, Feline Leukemia #2

18 WEEKS

Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Chlamydia, Initial Rabies

ANNUALLY

Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus and Chlamydia, Feline Leukemia, Rabies Booster

Feline Distemper

One of the most widespread of all cat diseases and is extremely contagious. Fever, loss of appetite, vomiting, and diarrhea. It is life threatening in kittens

Rhinotracheitis

A highly contagious respiratory disease. Sneezing, loss of appetite, fever and eye inflammation.

Calicivirus

A serious respiratory infection. Fever, loss of appetite, nasal discharge and ulcers on the tongue

Chlamydia

Sneezing, fever, loss of appetite, inflamed eyes and nasal discharge.

Feline Leukemia

Persistent infection that can have many ill effects depending upon the cat and can be fatal over time
